## **Speakers:**

Dannie Julian: "Leading in a Skirt: The Gendered Exceptionalism of Jacinda Ardern's Political Leadership"

This presentation is an adaptation of Dannie's thesis focusing on gendered mediation and calls for a gendered consciousness in mediated politics and the performance of leadership. It was presented at the ISLC 2023 Conference in Copenhagen and has been turned into a journal article that is currently submitted to Leadership's special issue.

Michael Bain: "Battling imposter syndrome: Conference presenting early on in your research journey"

This presentation will focus on Michael's experiences of sharing his research at the 2024 New Historians conference, including the challenges and benefits of presenting at academic conferences early on in the PhD research.
